MCST and the Ministry of Science and Technology of the People's Republic of China (MOST) where nominated as the implementing agencies for cooperation.





Personnel

Non-economic / de minimis GBER

- Project Management up to 10% of the <u>project value</u>
- Maximum of 1720 hours p.a.
- Hourly rates specified in national rules

(Student stipends EUR 6,000-8,000 per annum, part time students are eligible on pro-rata basis).

€z = (gross basic salary + allowances) / yearly workable hours of the employee.

² The term 'senior researcher' is to be used for a postdoctoral researcher with a specialist and high level of local and international experience in the field. Individuals possessing a high level of experience in industry can still be considered.

³ The term 'researcher' is to be used for a Bachelor's, <u>Master's</u> or a Ph.D. degree holder and hence the hourly rate should be eauivalent to the dearee held by the relevant individual

Instruments, Specialised Equipment and Consumables

Non-economic / de minimis

- Cost to purchase/lease specialised equipment.
- Cost of research consumables should not exceed 30% of the project value.

GBER

- Depreciation costs of specialised equipment for the extent and period used for the project. To be verified by a certified public accountant.
- Cost of specialised equipment is only eligible if the lifetime of the equipment is equal to the lifetime of the project.
- Cost of research consumables should not exceed 30% of the project value.







Travel and Subsistence

Non-economic/ de minimis

- Max. of 2 persons per meeting/event
- Economy flights, and public transport (most economic solutions) and per diems for up to 14 days in a row

GBER

Travel costs and subsistence are not eligible







Subcontracted activities

Non-economic/de minimis / GBER

- Allowed up to 25% of the project value
- Must follow fair procurement procedures
- To be discussed with the Call Manager at application stage


- Costs of knowledge transfer activities and patents bought or licensed from outside sources at arm's length conditions.
- To be discussed with the Call Manager at application stage

Overheads & other Operating Expenses


Non-economic/ de minimis / GBER

- Other operating expenses incurred directly as a result of the project
- These are covered at 20% of direct eligible costs











Ineligible costs

- 1. Expenses related to loans, interest etc.
- 2. Expenses which are recoverable through other funding mechanisms
- 3. Re-purchase of the same equipment originally procured through other funding mechanisms
- Purchase and/or leasing of equipment and services from partners or their subsidiaries
- 5. Standard office equipment
- 6. Personnel hours for travelling
- Any other costs that are not listed as eligible costs in the National Rules.
